### Combating corruption is one of the top priorities for the Ministry of Defence of Ukraine

Corruption significantly affects the level of national security and defence. The Ministry of Defence of Ukraine shall unite its efforts with the National Command Authorities, scientific and research institutions, and civil (non-governmental) organizations in order to eliminate corruption risks and implement the priority pillars of anti-corruption policy. This includes:

- 1. Establishment of an effective institutional mechanism to prevent corruption in the Ministry of Defence, military command structures of all levels, and the Armed Forces of Ukraine as well as to develop the capability to combat corruption in state enterprises, institutions, and organizations under control of the Ministry of Defence of Ukraine
- Development of personnel policy to ensure the integrity of military and civilian personnel as well as to establish a negative attitude towards corruption.
- Zero tolerance to corruption offenses during operations in support of sovereignty and territorial integrity of Ukraine or participation of the Armed Forces of Ukraine in international peacekeeping activities
- **4.** Elimination of corrupt practices and reformation of public procurement procedures.
- 5. Improvement of efficiency in managing financial resources and transparency in implementation of budgetary programs as well as development and support of internal control system and reinforcement of institutional capacity of internal audit.
- 6. Establishment of preconditions for submitting reports on violations of anti-corruption legislation and introduction of effective and deterrent measures against the officials involved in corruption offenses.
- 7. Provision of openness and transparency as well as public involvement in preventing corruption.

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## PREVENTING AND DETECTING CORRUPTION IN THE DEFENCE SECTOR


Ministry of Defence of Ukraine was the first central executive authority to develop the Anti-Corruption Program for 2015–2017

The Anti-Corruption Program of the Ministry of Defence for 2015—2017 is designed to create an effective system for preventing and detecting corruption in accordance with Article 19 of the Law of Ukraine "On Prevention of Corruption" and the Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine No. 265 of 29.04.2015 "On approval of the State Program on Implementation of State Anti-Corruption Policy in Ukraine (Anti-Corruption Strategy) for 2015—2017".

The Anti-Corruption Program of the Ministry of Defence of Ukraine considers the experience of developing similar documents by the Defence agencies of the United Kingdom, Norway, Poland, Bulgaria, Georgia as well as international non-governmental organization Transparency International.

## MINISTRY OF DEFENCE OF UKRAINE IMPLEMENTED AN EFFECTIVE MECHANISM TO PREVENT CORRUPTION IN 2015

2015 has become the year of institutional development of mechanism to prevent and detect corruption in the Ministry of Defence of Ukraine through the elaboration of major regulatory acts in this area in accordance with the Law of Ukraine "On Prevention of Corruption"

## INVESTIGATION OF CORRUPT PRACTICES IN MILITARY COMMAND STRUCTURES, MILITARY UNITS AND MILITARY COMMISSARIATS

Prevention of corruption or corruption-related offenses in military units operating in the area of ATO

- Development of accounting procedure for material and financial resources provided to military units by volunteer organizations as well as private and legal entities in the form of charity
- Introduction of amendments to anti-corruption legislation, including the simplification of procedure for special inspection and filing declarations by military personnel engaged in combat operations
- In-site inspection (in the area of ATO) of procedures and practices on incentive payments for the damaged weapons and military equipment of the enemy
- Establishment of Joint Monitoring Group with representatives from the Department of Audit and Financial Control of the Ministry of Defence of Ukraine and the Department of Finance of the Ministry of Defence of Ukraine at the ATO HQ
- Inspection of violations related to the disposal of diesel engines for armored vehicles, implementation of personnel decisions on the induction of field-grade and company-grade reserve officers into military service during the mobilization, as well as violations in one of military institutes of Kyiv and corruption offenses in one of the military commissariats of Odessa region
- Initiation of official investigation on the procurement procedures and quality control of body armor

#### Prevention of corruption or corruption-related offenses in military commissariats

- Analysis of corrupt practices in military commissariats during mobilization
- Implementation of the pilot project "Open Military Commissariat" and establishment of community centers within the facilities of military commissariats providing legal assistance to ATO participants and their families in resolving social problems
- **Establishment of the Unified Register of Obligated Reservists,** which makes it impossible for a citizen of Ukraine to avoid conscription thus reducing the discretionary authorities of officials at military commissariats
- In 2015, a total of **29 proceedings for offenses were introduced into the Unified Register of Pre-Trial Investigations** in relation to officials of military commissars

#### INTERNAL CONTROL AND AUDIT

The increased amount of budget and public attention to the Ministry of Defence required additional measures to ensure the fair, effective, efficient, and transparent management of public resources allocated for defence

In 2015, for the first time the **Minister of Defence of Ukraine adopted a Comprehensive Action Plan on the Development of Internal Control for 2015—2017**. This plan provides for researches, development of normative and methodological documents, exercises and training, implementation of pilot projects, and introduction of amendments to regulations and job descriptions in part of internal control.

## REFORMS IN THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE OF UKRAINE

The Ministry of Defence of Ukraine cooperates with the Reform Office to overcome bureaucratic obstacles and obsolete mechanisms in the sphere of logistical support of the Armed Forces of Ukraine. The Centre for Development and Monitoring over Logistical Support has been established to implement a range of projects on procurement as well as clothing and subsistence support to military personnel.


#### **BUILDING INTEGRITY**

#### Building integrity of military and civil personnel remains one of top priorities

Since 2015, the appointment to responsible positions (starting from the Deputy Minister of Defence) is made upon the evaluation of professional qualities and polygraph testing.

Special courses on building integrity and reducing corruption risks are established in the Training and Education Centre of the National Defence University of Ukraine named after I. Chernyahovskyi in support of building integrity process.

Internal audit is conducted in accordance with national standards of internal audit, which are based on corresponding international standards. Internal auditors undergo regular training on national and international standards of internal audit. The training on national standards is provided by the State Financial Inspection of Ukraine with the assistance of the Ministry of Economy and Finance of the Netherlands, while the international standards of internal audit ("Certified Internal Auditor") are trained by the HOCK Training with the assistance of the Ministry of Defence of the United Kingdom. The internal audit officials are additionally engaged in training activities under the aegis of International Organization Transparency International, NATO Building Integrity Program, NATO Liaison Office in Ukraine as well as other national and international organizations.



#### **OPENNESS AND TRANSPARENCY**

The measures undertaken by the Ministry of Defence of Ukraine to prevent corruption are based on the principles of openness and transparency

On December 26, 2014, the Minister of Defence of Ukraine approved the Action Plan on the implementation of the Strategy of the State Policy for Promoting the Development of Civil Society in 2015, which provides for cooperation in developing the intolerance to corruption.

The openness, transparency and resulting cooperation with public society in 2015 allows to receive information on anti-corruption offenses on a real-time basis and take appropriate measures.



#### INTERNATIONAL DEFENCE COOPERATION

#### **Enhancement of international defence cooperation**

The Ministry of Defence of Ukraine participates in the implementation of measures under the NATO Initiative on Building Integrity, Transparency, and Accountability and reduction of corruption risks in defence and security institutions (Building Integrity Program).

The Ministry of Defence of Ukraine actively cooperates with the Ministry of Defence of The United Kingdom, the Ministry of Defence of the Kingdom of Norway, and international organization Transparency International through Action Plans under the Partnership for Peace and Open Government Partnership programs.

Memorandum of Understanding as of June 23, 2015 between the Ministries of Defence of Ukraine and Norway resulted in the establishment of training course "Building Integrity and Institutional Development in the Sphere of Personnel Management". This project has been developed and implemented by the Project Group of the Ministry of Defence of Ukraine and the Centre for Building Integrity in the Defence Sector (CIDS) of the Ministry of Defence of the Kingdom of Norway.

In November 2015, the first International anti-corruption week together with a series of training courses and seminars on preventing and combating corruption were conducted for officials of the Ministry of Defence of Ukraine and the General Staff of the Armed Forces of Ukraine with the assistance of the Embassy of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland to Ukraine, international non-governmental organization Transparency International and the Centre for Integrity in the Defence Sector (CIDS).

For the first time in the history of the Armed Forces of Ukraine, the RAND Corporation (Research and Development) — the US research institution was involved upon the decision of the President of Ukraine to identify the areas for the reformation of the defense forces of Ukraine and to reach the criteria required for seeking membership with NATO.

## PRIORITIES OF THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE FOR COMBATING CORRUPTION IN 2016

#### Overcoming corruption is one of the top priorities for the Ministry of Defence of Ukraine

Ministry of Defence of Ukraine intends to establish a sustainable corruption prevention system in structural units of the Ministry of Defence of Ukraine, the General Staff of the Armed Forces of Ukraine, other military command structures and Armed Forces of Ukraine as well and institutions, organizations and off-budget entities under control of the Ministry of Defence

Anti-Corruption Program of the Ministry of Defence of Ukraine for 2015—2017 is approved by the order of the Ministry of Defence of Ukraine No. 374 of July 30, 2015.

- Establishment of an effective institutional mechanism to prevent corruption in the Ministry of Defence and the Armed Forces of Ukraine as well as to develop the capability to combat corruption in state enterprises, institutions, and organizations under control of the Ministry of Defence of Ukraine
- Implementation of preventive anti-corruption mechanisms in support to the operations of the Armed Forces of Ukraine in the area of ATO and training of troops for international peacekeeping operations
- Reduction of the level of corruption in the sphere of public procurements
- Consolidation of the personnel policies, building integrity of military and civilian personnel and establishment of negative attitude towards corruption
- Establishment of conditions for submitting reports on violations of anti-corruption legislation and implementation of effective and deterrent measures against officials involved in corruption offenses

- Attraction of maximum support of the society, implementation of openness and transparency as well as public involvement in preventing corruption
- Enhancement of the level of management of financial, logistical and other resources as well as transparency in the implementation of budgetary programs, establishment and support of the system of internal control, and consolidation of the institutional capacity of internal audit



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
